<p>2. Treasurer Report inc. audited accounts <b>Lewis Birch</b></p>	<p>Lewis Birch has audited the club accounts. Figures are not yet finalised for the committee meeting as the accounting year ends 30th April. Two end of season do's in one year so therefore club balance is looking a little different to historic comparisons. Teamo has made tracking payments more of an efficient and organised process. Higher interest Honorable mention to Simeon Field who obtained £2000 net gain from sponsorship and managed to pay for the Romsey Relay Tea. Income for the year is just shy of £49000. We made a £5000 profit. It's great that year on year we are increasing profit. We are waiting for a bill from HCS. The accounts will be finalised for the next committee meeting. Money outstanding £450 on Match Fees. Teamo is easier for collecting data, sub but because there are so many combinations of how players subscribe it is hard and very time consuming to track. So a suggestion presented by Lewis is that we should do a one hit subscription at the start of the season and a pay as you play all via teamo. This would be £14 change to those paying monthly. Lewis raises keeping match fees the same but next year increase the subs next year. Committee to think about 3 proposals for fees and then send out to the club to be decided at a later date. <b>There will be no match fee changes for adults 2019-2020 season.</b></p>

### **Romsey Mens 4XI Captains Report**

This was Romsey Mens 4s Fourth Season and the second in Division 9 South following the league restructure two years ago combining Divs 9 & 10 in to a 9 North and 9 South.

Romsey finished fourth out of 8 teams, with the top 4 teams including Romsey split by 8 points, with a further 8 points to 5th.

We played 15 games, but the 8-1 win against Gosport was effectively a friendly as that team folded, so league wise it was

Played 14 Won 8 Drawn 1 Lost 5. Scoring 43 goals and conceding 40. Finishing on 25 points, with IOW2 winning the league with 33 points, and suffering only one defeat all season which was at the hands of Romsey that included Dave Miles annual Mens 4s appearance.

Top Scorer for the season was Sean Rawles with 10 goals, including three hat tricks in consecutive matches back in the Autumn.

Colin Harwood scored 9 goals, and Carl Hendy who only played 3 matches for the 4s as he played up in the 3s after Christmas scored 5, and remains the Mens 4s top scorer of all time to date with 48 goals.

33 different players made at least one appearance for the Mens 4s, of the 15 matches played Colin Harwood and Simon Field played 14 each missing only one match, and other regulars were Sean Rawles with 11, Andy Moger with 11 (who sadly is moving away for next season), Lukasz Suleja with 10 and then James Tower, Bryn Wathen, Matt Duke, Stan Cazaly and Ollie O'Hara all with 9.

The number of players from the 4s who played up in the 3s and 2s really showed how some of the younger players had developed, with Player of the Season James Tower being a great example, he sadly is also not around next season as he is in Canada.

To keep the team going Simeon Field reached out to a few Dads, and we incorporated Pete O'Hara, Phil Orak and Dave Procter as post Christmas regulars hopefully they will all be keen to continue next season.

The Mens 4s provides an opportunity for U14s to play Saturday hockey, and build confidence and ability as well as socialising afterwards with the 'older' players. Will Payne was a good asset before Christmas, but proved he could

play higher up quite quickly, and Josh Harwood and Stan Cazaly became 2s players by the end of the season and will start there in 2019/20.

It has been really enjoyable playing with a wide range of age and abilities and looking ahead it should be the Mens 4s that push players up, so substitutes next year may be a premium. It will be a challenge to move the team out of the Division, but the Mens 4s does allow for a Back to Hockey and new younger players to have a go.
